Europe is burdened by a chronically high rate of unemployment. Especially among young people the perspectives for a good job are discouraging. In its policies, the European Union clearly gives priority to measures against unemployment. The riots among youngsters in the suburbs of French cities last fall have been taken as a signal that the growing frustration of a whole generation endangers the very concept of the Union. Of course, unemployment hits the lower educated and immigrants most.

The picture in South East Europe is even more dismal: Youth unemployment is connected with a low level of democratisation and weak post – war economies, which means that also the higher-educated stay without a job, and as a result, aim towards the labour market of the European Union, for example. The result of this development is not a "brain gain" for Europe, but rather a "brain waste", since qualified people from SEE very often face the reality of poorly-paid jobs with low educational requirements within the EU.
